Peg Haggerty is an RN, with a BSN from Viterbo University (LaCrosse, WI), an MSN in Nursing Admin/Nurse Educator from Winona State University (Winona, MN), and an EdD in Educational Leadership from Saint Mary's University of Minnesota (Winona, MN).

She recently retired as the Vice President of Patient Care Services at Columbus Community Hospital in Columbus, WI, where she spent the last five years of her career. She started her career as a staff nurse, advancing into management positions both in the acute and ambulatory settings with Gundersen Lutheran. She then moved into Academia as an Associate Professor at Viterbo University and taught in the Graduate Nursing Program and developed the online Nursing Leadership in Healthcare Track (Nursing Administration). She also taught classes for the Servant Leadership Program. After five years of teaching in the graduate nursing program, she pursued an opportunity as Vice President of Patient Care Services at Columbus Community Hospital, Columbus, Wisconsin. Due to her love of teaching she has continued as adjunct faculty for Concordia University in the online MSN and DNP programs and for Viterbo University in their MSN Program, sharing her knowledge and expertise from her leadership experiences.

She is currently President-Elect for the Wisconsin Organization for Nurse Executives (W-ONE) and will become President for a two-year term beginning January 2012. She is also a member of the American Organization of Nurse Executives (AONE), Wisconsin Nurses Association, American Nurses Association, Sigma Theta Tau, and American Colleges of Healthcare Executives.
