### Directions coming from the east on Hwy. 190 (Capitol Drive)

Travel west on Capitol Drive. Turn left onto Hwy. 16 East. Take first exit, Main Street (exit 188). Turns left off hwy. ramp and proceeds to the WCTC main entrance on right.

### Directions coming from the east on I-94

### Directions coming from the west on I-94

Travel east on I-94. Exit Hwy. T (exit 293). Turn left onto Hwy. T. Follow Hwy. T North about 2 miles to the WCTC main entrance on left.

### Directions coming from the west on Hwy. 16

Travel east on Hwy. 16 East. Exit Main Street (exit 188). Turn left off hwy. ramp and proceeds to the WCTC main entrance on right.

### Directions from the airport

Head north on S Howell Ave/WI-38 N  
Turn left at W Grange Ave (signs for I-94)  
Turn left onto the ramp to I-94  
Merge onto Airport Spur  
Take the exit toward I-94 W/US-41 N  
Keep right at the fork, follow signs for I-894 W/Milwaukee/I-94/US-41 and merge onto I-94 W/US-41 N  
Take exit 316 on the left for I-43 S/I-894-BYP toward Madison/Fond du Lac  
Merge onto I-43 S/I-894 W  
Continue to follow I-894 W  
Take exit 1B on the left to merge onto I-94 W toward Madison  
Take exit 293C to merge onto WI-16 W toward Pewaukee  
Take exit 188 for CR-JJ toward Main St  
Turn left at CR-JJ W  
Turn right at CR-JJ/Grandview Blvd  
Continue to follow CR-JJ to 800 Main Street Pewaukee, WI. 53072

## Doing More with Less: The Nursing Curriculum in the New Economy.

### Dr Beverly Malone PhD, RN, FAAN

Dr. Malone started her tenure as CEO for the US National League for Nursing on February 1, 2007. Prior to that she was general secretary of the Royal College of Nursing, a post she held since July 2001. Dr. Malone received her BS in Nursing from the University of Cincinnati in Ohio; MS in Adult Psychiatric Nursing from Rutgers, the State University in New Brunswick, New Jersey; and her PhD in Clinical Psychology from the University of Cincinnati.

Dr. Malone has worked as a surgical staff nurse, clinical nurse specialist, director of nursing, and assistant administrator of nursing. While working as dean and professor of the School of Nursing at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, Greensboro, she served on the Governor's Task Force on the Nursing Shortage, and was a commissioner of the North Carolina Commission on Health Services.

A former psychiatric nurse, she served as president of the American Nurses Association (ANA) (1996-2000.). During her presidency, Dr. Malone served on President Clinton's Advisory Commission on Consumer Protection and Quality in the Health Care Industry. She has been included in Ebony Magazine's list of the 100 most influential African-Americans.
